BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF JEFFERSON DAVIS PARISH, LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION CONVENED ON SEPTEMBER 14, 2022 THAT:

The Jefferson Davis Parish Zoning Map is hereby amended to reflect the rezoning from A-1 Agricultural/Residential to I-1 Light Industrial for a crawfish

The motion was made by Mr. Guillory, seconded by Mr. Buller, and carried, to approve the surplus of a 2013 Dodge Ram 1500 Truck, Unit #3 bearing Tag No. FD6 0700; a 1976 White Ford 800 Fire Truck, Engine #2 bearing Tag No. FD6 5359; and a 1986 Green/Yellow 8000 Fire Truck, Ladder Truck bearing Tag No. 5716; to be sold at auction for Fire District No. 6.

# A RESOLUTION REGARDING A LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING A "ROSENBAUER FIRE APPARATUS"

WHEREAS, Upon approval of legal counsel, the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury desires to enter into that certain Lease Purchase Agreement by and between Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury and Government Capital Corporation, for the purpose of financing a "Rosenbauer Fire Apparatus" on behalf of Jefferson Davis Parish Fire Protection District No. 5. The Police Jury desires to designate this Agreement as a "qualified tax exempt obligation" of the Police Jury for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The Police Jury desires to designate Donald Woods, Board President as an authorized signer of the Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF JEFFERSON DAVIS:

## Section 1.

That the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury enters into a Lease Purchase Agreement with Government Capital Corporation for the purpose of financing a "Rosenbauer Fire Apparatus" on behalf of Jefferson Davis Parish Fire Protection District No. 5.

#### Section 2

That the Lease Purchase Agreement by and between the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury and Government Capital Corporation is designated by the Police Jury as a "qualified tax exempt obligation" for the purposes of Section 265 (b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

## Section 3.

That the Police Jury designates J. Steven Eastman, Board President, as an authorized signer of the Lease Purchase Agreement by and between the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury and Government Capital Corporation.

#### Section 4.

That should the need arise, if applicable, the Police Jury will use proceeds for reimbursement of expenditures related to the Property, within the meaning of Treasury Regulation § 1.150-2, as promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
