State Street, Jennings, Louisiana, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, plans to consider adopting a resolution ordering and calling an election to be held within the Parish of Jefferson Davis to authorize the renewal of an ad valorem tax therein.

The motion was made by Mr. Peterson, seconded by Mr. McKnight, and carried, to approve the minutes of the meeting held on January 12, 2022, as written and submitted.

Mr. Marceaux reported the Finance Committee meeting was held on Monday, February 7, 2022 at 7:00 A.M. All bills were reviewed and declared in order with the Committee recommending approval.

ORDINANCE NO. _2389

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 5, Animals and Fowl.

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury is empowered to adopt amendments and revisions of its ordinances by Louisiana Revised Statutes.

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury is desirous of exercising said power; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury, and it is hereby ordained by the same:

Amend Chapter 5, Sec 5-17 to read:

Sec. 5-17. - Notice of impounding.

Whenever any animal described in section 5-16 shall be taken up or confined as herein provided, the owner or owners thereof, if known, shall be notified by the person taking up or confining them within three (3) days thereafter; if unknown, the parish shall attempt to notify the owner by posting a notice on the door of the Police Jury Office and on its social media page and/or website. Such notice shall state briefly the kind and description of such animal taken up or confined, giving any brands or marks which may be found on such animal, and the date on which the animal was taken up or confined.

(Ord. No. 180, § 2 7-5-23)

Amend Chapter 5, Sec 15-18 to read:

Sec. 5-18. - Impounding fees.

The person or agency taking up or confining any of the animals described in section 5-16 of this article as hereinabove provided, shall receive fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day per animal plus any applicable veterinary charges. The person or agency transporting any animal shall receive two hundred dollars (\$200.00). Owners of said animals shall be responsible for all impounding fees. All fees will be collected by the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury. The animals shall be confined at the Kinder Livestock Auction, 13008 Hwy 190 West, Kinder LA 70648.

Amend Chapter 5, Sec 15-19 to read:

Sec. 5-19. - Advertisement, sale of impounded stock.

At the expiration of seven days of confinement of livestock, as provided in section 5-17, should the owner fail to come forward and pay the charges and penalties provided in section 5-18, the animal(s) shall be sold at public auction to the highest bidder with the proceeds to go toward all applicable charges contained in section 5-18 and that any remaining amounts to be paid to the owner upon identification.

Amend Chapter 5, Sec 5-20 to be removed.

Amend Chapter 5, Sec 5-22 to read:

Sec. 5-22. - Residents and property owners may notify legal officers of animals at large.

Any resident or property owner of this parish, instead of taking up any of the animals described in <u>section 5-16</u> that may run, roam or be at large in violation of the provisions of this article may notify the sheriff or the constable of the ward, as the case may be, in which said animals may be, of such violations, in which event it shall be the duty of the sheriff or the constable, as the case may be, to immediately seize, take up, confine and impound such animals.
