The meeting was called to order by President Steve Eastman. Mrs. Landry gave the Invocation and Mr. Fruge led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The President invited Reese “Skip” Broussard and Shalon Latour to introduce themselves as possible candidates for District 37 State Representative.

Mr. Lafargue reported the Finance Committee meeting was held on November 19, 2025. The Administrator presented the Projected 2026 Budget, outlining anticipated revenues and expenditures for the upcoming fiscal year.

The Finance Committee recommends providing a \$48,000 loan from the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury to Fire District 6, to be repaid from future Ad Valorem tax collections.

A motion was made by Mr. Lafargue, seconded by Mr. Lejeune, and carried, to accept the committee’s recommendation.

The Finance Committee further recommends increasing the Management Fee charged by the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury to 2.5% for each Fund, with the exception of the Fire Districts, which will remain at 1.5%.

The motion was made by Mr. Lafargue, seconded by Mr. Labouve, and carried, to accept the committee’s recommendation.

Mr. Lafargue reported the Finance Committee convened on December 8, 2025, at 7:00 AM, but with an absence of a quorum, no official action was taken during this meeting. The Committee agreed to schedule a follow-up meeting.

Mr. Lafargue reported the Finance Committee met on December 10, 2025, at 4:45 PM.

Mr. Lafargue made a motion, seconded by Mr. Labouve, and carried, to accept the recommendation of the committee to approve the amendment of DCMC Task Order No. 31 – Consulting Services Support – to increase the not-to-exceed amount to \$98,860.

A motion was made by Mr. Lafargue, seconded by Ms. Myers, and carried, to accept the recommendation of the committee and approve the payment to Jeff Davis Parish Economic Development Commission in the amount of \$9,000.

All bills were reviewed and declared in order with the Committee recommending approval.

It was moved by Mr. Lafargue, seconded by Mr. McKnight, and carried, to pay the following bills, to wit:

It was moved by Mr. Peterson, seconded by Ms. Myers, and carried, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting held on November 12, 2025, as written and submitted.

A motion was made by Mr. LeJeune, seconded by Mr. Buller, and carried, authorizing the President to sign the Right of Way Deed for the Aylsworth Road Bridge Work, to be conducted by the Coushatta Tribe of Louisiana.

The motion was made by Mr. Lafargue, seconded by Ms. Myers, and carried, approving the President to sign Contract Amendment #2 extending DCMC Master Services Agreement Contract, extending the period of performance to January 11, 2027.

A motion to Ratify the action of the Agenda Committee to move forward with Topsy Project #2025004, per Program Amendment Number #1, as approved by the Office of Community Development (OCD), authorizing Bluewing Civil Consulting (BWC) to resume its professional services, and authorize the President to sign all documents associated with said amended project, having been moved by Mr. Buller, seconded by Mr. McKnight, and carried.

There was a motion by Mr. Labouve, seconded by Ms. Myers, and carried, to authorize the advertisement for bids in connection with the semi-annual supply purchases.

Mr. Fruge reported that the Office Policy Committee met on December 13, 2025. It is the recommendation of the Committee to approve the change of employment status of the temporary Office Assistant to full-time Office Assistant.

A motion was made by Mr. Fruge, seconded by Mr. McKnight, and carried, to accept the Committee's recommendation.

President Eastman reported that the Zoning Commission held a public hearing on Wednesday, December 3, 2025. The Commission received public comments in connection with a proposed rezoning request from T.O. Allen Estate, represented by Gene and Gayle Godeaux, for a change in zoning classification from A-1 to I-1. It is the recommendation of the Commission to approve the zoning request from A-1 to I-1.

The motion was made by Mr. Labouve, seconded by Mr. LeJeune, and carried, to accept the report of the Zoning Commission.

A Public Hearing was held to receive any further comments in connection with a rezoning request from Gene and Gayle Godeaux, representing the T.O. Allen Estate, for a change in zoning classification from A-1 to I-1 for property located on Highway 90, west of Lacassine, all in Jefferson Davis Parish. Cecilee Oliver spoke in favor of the rezoning request.

There was a motion by Mr. Labouve, seconded by Ms. Myers, to adopt an Ordinance changing the zoning classification from A-1 to I-1 for T.O. Allen Estate. The roll was called, and the following votes were recorded:

ORDINANCE NO. 2474

AN ORDINANCE amending the Jefferson Davis Parish Zoning Map to reflect the rezoning of certain property from A-1 Agricultural/Residential to I-1 Light Industrial, said property belonging to T.O. Allen Estate, represented by Gene and Gayle Godeaux, being located in Jefferson Davis Parish, Louisiana.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF JEFFERSON DAVIS PARISH, LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION CONVENED December 10, 2025, THAT:

The Jefferson Davis Parish Zoning Map is hereby amended to reflect the rezoning from A-1 Agricultural/Residential to I-1 Light Industrial of the following property belonging to, T.O. ALLEN ESTATE, represented by Gene and Gayle Godeaux, to wit:

An undivided 13.4% interest in and to that certain parcel of ground, together with all buildings and improvements located thereon in Jefferson Davis Parish, being more duly described as:

- a. All that part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 26, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian, South of the right of way of the Louisiana Western Railroad
- b. The South Half of Lots 15 & 16 and the South 3/4ths of Lot 17 and all of Lot 18 of the Calcasieu Citrus Fruit and Fig Orchards Subdivision being a subdivision of the Southwest Quarter of Section 25, and all that part of the Southeast Quarter and the Northeast Quarter of Southwest Quarter of Section 26 lying South of the Louisiana Western Railroad and the South Half of Southwest Quarter of Section 26, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian.
- c. All that part of the South Half of Section 27, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian, lying South of the right of way of the Louisiana Western Railroad.
- d. All that part of the South Half of Section 28, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian, lying South of the Louisiana Western Railroad right of way and East of the Missouri Pacific Railroad right of way LESS AND EXCEPT the following: Beginning at a point 848 feet West of the Southeast Corner of Section 28, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian, thence in a Northeasterly direction 1599 feet to the East line of said Section, thence North 882 feet to the South boundary line of the right of way of the Southern Pacific Railroad; thence West along the South line of said railroad 150 feet, thence South 843 feet, thence in a Southwesterly direction 1605 feet to the South line of said Section, thence East along the South line of said Section, 150 feet to the point of beginning, being a strip 150 feet wide.
- e. The West Half of the West Half and the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 35, Township 9 South, Range 6 West, LA Meridian.

LESS AND EXCEPT the following:

That certain tract or parcel of land, together with all buildings & improvements thereon, appurtenances and privileges thereto belonging or in anywise pertaining and being more particularly described as beginning at the Southwest corner of Section 35, Township 9 South, Rang 6 West, Jefferson Davis Parish, LA and running thence North 0 degrees, 19 minutes 10 seconds West, a distance of 1,657.13 feet; thence South 74 degrees 47 minutes East, a distance of 99.91 feet; thence South 40 degrees 46 minutes 10 seconds East, a distance of 152.14 feet; thence South 38 degrees 32 minutes 20 seconds East, a distance of 731.99 feet; thence South 89 degrees 51 minutes 10 seconds East, a distance of 2,018.05 feet; thence South 0 degrees 15 minutes 55 seconds East, a distance of 944.77 feet; thence North 89 degrees 51 minutes 10 seconds West, a distance of 2,665 feet along the public road, to the point of beginning, all as per plat of survey by Letz Engineers, dated December 8, 1987 by Harold J. Letz, Land Surveyor, said tract containing 63.75 acres.

Ms. Myers reported that the Ordinance Committee met on Wednesday, November 12, 2025, and reviewed the proposed revisions to portions of Chapter 21 (Zoning) of the Code of Ordinances,

Chapter 21 – Zoning:

- Revised Section 21-2 to modify and expand the definition of “Farm.”
- Updated Section 21-11.1(2) Agricultural & Resource-Based Uses to include allowable sales of raw agricultural products sold directly from producers to consumers, as well as low-risk home-prepared foods permitted under Revised Statute (R.S.) 40:4.9, which includes items such as baked goods, jams, honey, pickles, and similar products, with annual sales limited to \$30,000.00.
- Updated Section 21-11.1(7) to define Industrial, Storage & Utility as public facilities used for storing and dispatching public works equipment and materials, and private utility facilities limited to equipment, vehicle and material storage, with onsite buildings restricted to 200 sq. ft.

It is the recommendation of the Committee to approve the revisions.

Ms. Myers made a motion, seconded by Mr. McKnight, and carried, to accept the report of the Ordinance Committee.

A Public Hearing was held to receive comments and consider adopting Ordinance(s) amending Chapter 21 - Zoning as follows:

Article 1. In General Section 21-2. Definitions

Article IV. Schedule of Zoning District Regulations Section 21-11.1. Zoning districts. (a)2 Agricultural & Resource-Based Uses & (a)7 Industrial, Storage & Utility Uses. No public comments were received.

ORDINANCE NO. 2475

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 21 ZONING, Article I In General and Article IV Schedule of Zoning District Regulations

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury is empowered to adopt amendments and revisions of its ordinances by Louisiana Revised Statutes.

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury is desirous of exercising said power; now therefore

BE IT ORDAINED by the Jefferson Davis Parish Police Jury, and it is hereby ordained by the same:

Chapter 21 ZONING, Article I In General Section 21-2. Definitions, the definition of *Farm* is hereby amended to read as follows:

Farm. Any parcel of land devoted to agricultural that is immediately and directly employed in cultivation, production, and harvest of crops or in the raising of management of livestock such that \$1,000 or more of agricultural products are normally produced and sold annually. This definition shall apply to agricultural driveways and exemptions related to Act 12 of LA Revised Statutes 40:1730.21 and 40:1730.30

Chapter 21 ZONING, Article IV Schedule of Zoning District Regulations, Sec 21-11.1 Zoning districts (a) 2 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2. Agricultural & Resource-Based Uses

Farm and farm-related buildings, stables, roadside stand for products grown on premises, coastal zone sites, oil and gas exploration, oil and gas pump transfer stations, private nurseries (horticultural), agricultural or forestry property, private and public gardens.

The sale of raw agricultural commodities—such as fruits, vegetables, honey, eggs, milk, meat, or similar products. Sales must occur directly between the farmer (producer) and the consumer (end user).

Low-risk foods prepared in the home for direct sale to consumers that are exempt from the requirements of the State Sanitary Code, as defined in Louisiana Revised Statute R.S. 40:4.9, including the limitation that gross annual sales of said foods shall be less than thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). Eligible products shall be limited to those identified in R.S. 40:4.9(E), including

baked goods, candies, cane syrup, dried mixes, honey and honeycomb products, jams, jellies, preserves, pickles, acidified foods, sauces, syrups, and spices. Any future amendments to R.S. 40:4.9 shall be automatically incorporated herein and reflected in this land use classification.

Chapter 21 ZONING, Article IV Schedule of Zoning District Regulations, Sec 21-11.1 Zoning districts (a) 7 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7. Industrial, Storage & Utility Uses

A facility operated by public entity for the purpose of storing, maintaining, and dispatching public works equipment, vehicles, and materials used in road, drainage, and facility maintenance or other governmental functions. Typical improvements may include equipment sheds, material stockpiles (such as gravel, culverts, or aggregate), fuel storage tanks, workshops, employee offices, and fenced outdoor storage areas.

A facility operated by a private utility for the limited purpose of storing equipment, vehicles, and materials necessary for utility maintenance or service operations. Onsite buildings shall be limited to 200 Square Feet.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Chapter 21, ZONING, Article 1, In General, Section 21-2, Definitions and Article IV, Schedule of Zoning District Regulation, Sec 21-11.1, Zoning districts, is hereby amended.

A resolution providing for canvassing the returns and declaring the results of the special election held in the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana, on Saturday, November 15, 2025, to authorize the extension and rededication of a sales and use tax therein.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), that:

SECTION 1. Canvass. This Governing Authority does now proceed in open and public session to examine the official tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the Parish, on SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 15, 2025, to authorize the extension and rededication of a sales and use tax therein, and said Governing Authority does further proceed to examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the special election.

SECTION 2. Election Results. According to the official certified tabulation of votes cast at said Election, there was a total of **1,376** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition and a total of **1,391** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition, resulting in a majority of **15** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition. The Proposition was therefore duly **DEFEATED** by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the Election.

SECTION 3. Promulgation of Election Result. The results of said election shall be promulgated by publication in the manner provided by law, after receipt from the Secretary of State's office of the actual costs of the election, as required by §18:1292 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 4. Declaration. The foregoing results of the Election are hereby declared by this Governing Authority and shall be published as required by law.

SECTION 5. Procès Verbal. A *Procès Verbal* of the canvass of the returns of said election shall be made and a certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who shall record the same in her office; and another copy thereof shall be retained in the archives of this Governing Authority.

BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED that on Wednesday, December 10, 2025, at 5:00 p.m., at its regular meeting place, the Police Jury Meeting Room of the Sidney Briscoe Building, 304 N. State Street, Jennings, Louisiana, the Police Jury of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), and being the authority ordering the special election held therein on Saturday, November 15, 2025, with a quorum being present, did examine the official certified tabulations of votes cast at the said election, and did examine and canvass the returns of said election, there having been submitted at said election the following proposition to wit:

PROPOSITION
(SALES TAX EXTENSION & REDEDICATION)

Shall the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), be authorized to continue to levy and collect a 1/2% sales and use tax (the "Tax") in accordance with Louisiana law (an estimated \$3,300,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years from and after July 1, 2034, with the proceeds of the Tax heretofore or hereafter collected to be used for the purposes of acquiring, constructing, improving, operating, and maintaining jail facilities and animal shelter facilities for the Parish, and for providing additional support for animal control operations in the Parish?

There was found by said count and canvass that there was a total of **1,376** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition and a total of **1,391** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition, as hereinabove set forth, and it was further found and determined that there was a majority of **15** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition as hereinabove set forth.

Therefore, the Governing Authority did declare and proclaim and does hereby declare and proclaim in open and public session that the Proposition as hereinabove set forth was duly **DEFEATED** by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the said special election.





PROPOSITION
SALES TAX - REVISION & REDEDICATION
Shall the Parish of Jefferson Davis, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), be authorized to continue to levy and collect a 1.2% sales and use tax (the "Tax") in accordance with Louisiana law (as estimated \$3,300,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the Tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years from and after July 1, 2025, with the proceeds of the Tax hereafter or hereafter collected to be used for the purposes of acquiring, constructing, improving, operating, and maintaining facilities and capital shelter facilities for the Parish, said for providing additional support for animal control operations in the Parish?
